

Gardeners may rent up to two 20 x 20 plots each season.

All Garden plots shall be used for personal not commercial use. Extra produce may be put into the kiosk on Westmor

A variety of plots shall be available to rent. Plots shall measure 20 x 20 or the equivalent of 400 square feet, 10 x 20 or the equivalent of 200 square feet, or 10 x 10 or the equivalent of 100 square feet.

Gardeners shall leave a margin of a minimum of 1 foot around all 4 sides of the plot to allow for plant growth, and walk space.

All plants, irrigation equipment, hoses and weeds need to be kept within a gardener's plot to keep the pathways clear for mowing and walking. Plants growing outside a plot may be mowed or pruned to maintain clear pathways.

~~All irrigation equipment shall be kept within the boundaries of the plot.~~

Gardeners shall manage the weeds and grasses within and around their plots.

Gardeners shall be responsible for mowing the margins of their plots. Gardeners within each section may want to share the responsibility of mowing the margins of their section of plots.

~~To save Gardeners work and time weeding,~~ To be proactive on weed control and management, it is highly recommended that a layer of cardboard with a layer of 6 to 12 inches of straw / marsh hay on top be placed in the larger open areas of a plot. Newspapers, cardboard, and straw / marsh hay may be used between plants or hills of plants.

Gardeners who choose not to mulch gardens must realize that they need to tend to their gardens several times a week to mitigate weeds.

Tall plants that grow over 3 ft or plants grown on trellises need to be planted so that they do not cast a shadow on a neighbors plot.

Gardeners should not enter another gardener's plot unless invited or given permission.

Gardeners may create a compost pile in their own plot.

~~All plants, equipment and weeds need to be kept within a gardener's plot to keep the pathways clear for mowing and walking. Plants growing outside a plot may be mowed or pruned to maintain clear pathways.~~



All drip irrigation equipment needs to fit within the garden plot and not extend into the pathways to hinder mowing.

All hoses need to be wound onto the hose wheels and not be left in the pathways.
