Average frost dates in the 53588 zip code are **September 28 through May 10**. Many people wait until Memorial Day weekend, or any time after May 22, to plant.

There are two different types of vegetables: **Cool Season** and **Warm Season**

Often Cool Season crops are not affected by a light frost, but some are so be aware.
